## WHAT DID YOUR DONATION TO THE UNITED WAY OF DANVILLE AREA DO FOR THE RESIDENTS OF DANVILLE/TILTON IN 2010?

**Big Brothers Big Sisters:** Provided one-to-one traditional mentoring to 50 children. In school-based mentoring provided 95 children with one-to-one mentoring at 12 different schools. Trained 35 new mentors for the traditional program. Provided match support for 15 on-going matches. Trained 65 for our school-based program. These mentors provided thousands of hours of one-to-one mentoring. The Young Women Aware Program provided 135 middle and high school girls with education on pregnancy prevention, high school achievement and college obtainment. Provided activities for children in Danville/Tilton on the waiting list. Provided information and referral for all parents of children on the waitlist and matched. Provided information on ADHD, violence prevention and resource availability. Provided information on Toys for Tots and the food bank.

**Boy Scouts, Prairielands Council:** 169 boys were enrolled in "ScoutReach" as Cub Scouts or Boy Scouts at Boys & Girls Club or Laura Lee Fellowship House. In total Scouting was provided to 634 youth in the Danville Area, however, United Way funds are designated only for support of the "ScoutReach" program.

**Boys & Girls Club:** Served 600 girls & boys in 2010. Youth served were ages 6-18. The background of members varied greatly; however, most members came from disadvantaged circumstances. Two-thirds of the members lived in single-guardian households and over half of them received free or reduced lunches. Continued to use the 22,000 sq. ft. facility to provide area youth with a safe place to learn & grow, opportunities to build ongoing relationships with caring professional adults. Life-enhancing programs and character development experiences and most importantly, hope and opportunity. Services provided through 5 comprehensive program areas: Arts, Character & Leadership Development, Education & Career Development, Health & Life skills, and Sports, Fitness & Recreation. The program is offered after school and during the summer at the main facility, the Mervis Unit. During the after-school program, members are served a snack each day and provided with a meal on Fridays, lunch and a snack are provided daily during the Summer Program. Each day, members engage in educational activities activities (tutoring, homework assistance, development exercises) during Power Hour and partake in initiatives such as drug, alcohol, tobacco & premature sexual activity resistance programs, leadership clubs, computer training, etiquette courses & community services.

**CASA of Vermilion County:** 40 CASA volunteers provided 1,720 advocacy service hours to 89 child victims of abuse and/or neglect in Vermilion County. Advocacy services include regular, frequent visits with the appointed child or sibling group, interviewing all individuals involved in the child's life (foster parents, biological parents, family members, teachers, doctors, caseworkers, counselors, law enforcement, daycare providers, etc.) and attending Administrative Case Reviews and Family Team meetings pertaining to their case. CASA volunteer attend all their appointed child's court hearings, providing written court reports to the judge. These reports include information about the child, the child's wishes and a summary of their findings and recommendations as to any needed services and what permanency option they have determined is in the best interest of the child. The cases for 21 children closed in 2010. 63% (13) of these children were returned home; 37% (8) of these children were adopted.

**Catholic Charities:** 162 families in Danville and 6 families in Tilton

**Center for Children's Services:** 82 pregnant and teen parents with 78 children and 18 participating fathers in home visits and/or group services.

**Children's Dyslexia Center of East Central Illinois:** 6 students being tutored, 3 initial tutors, 5 certified tutors

**CRIS Senior Services:** 14,376 congregate meals were served to 538 different people at the 3 meals sites within Danville. 446,474 meals were delivered from the three sites to 347 homes of the frail elderly. 415 people utilized transportation services. 1787 residents received Information and Assistance.

**Crosspoint Human Services:** Served 1787 residents. Some people were served in multiple programs which include: 24/7 mobile crisis response that provides on the spot assessment and treatment, psychiatric assessment, medication prescription and monitoring, supervised group homes and apartments for independent living, recovery services that include therapy, case management and life skills training. **Danville Family YMCA:** 938 families and 910 individuals participated as members in a variety of activities including Tae Kwon Do, swim lessons, gymnastics lessons, day camp, teen leadership and youth basketball. Many of these adults, teens, and youth who participated in Teens in Training improved their health by using the fitness equipment, fitness classes, personal training, the pool and the gyms. 1474 families and 1760 individuals participated in lessons, camping, youth basketball, and daily use as non-members. The Splash Program (water safety for second graders) has been conducted for all of District #118 and several other area parochial and public schools.

**Girl Scouts of Central Illinois:** Served 133 girls and 31 adults in the Leadership Development Program. Girls had the opportunity to participate in – events and activities all located within Vermilion County. By participating in these events girls discovered how to be safe in the water at the Water Safety workshop at Turtle Run, practice safe cookie selling techniques at the Cookie Rally held at the Danville Skateland, be aware of asthma issues at the Asthma Awareness Activity at the Boys & Girls Club, learn CPR & First Aid at Southside Church Accident Prevention event and how to use self-defense techniques at the annual Super Silly Sleepover. **Laura Lee Fellowship House:** 4849 individuals were members. 80 (K-12 grades) students participated daily in the Lights-On After School tutoring Program, 192 senior citizens (jolly Seniors, Lunch and Learn and Golden Seniors) participated in various social, recreational and educational programs and received weekly meals provided by CRIS. 52 boys participated in Boy Scouts. 60 girls participated in Girl Scouts. 2563 children participated in gym activities, increased computer literacy and participated in other organized activities on a daily basis. 140 adults participated in the Fitness and Wellness Center weekly. Total annual participation from: Youth Development-4770; Educational Services-4869; Senior Services-1934; Cultural and Community Services-6825; Recreational Services-7899 and Special Events-8579.

**Peer Court:** 71 youth offenders went through Peer Court trial and received post sentencing services. 78 youth participated in the legal process as Peer Court jurors. 14 youth received training in juvenile justice issues while serving as Teen Attorneys.

**Prairie Center Health Systems:** As of the 3rd quarter of FY11, 91 5th-12th grade students have been involved in the Too Good for Drugs and Too Good for violence curriculums, as well as other supplemental/related sessions. Students have also participated in crafts/interactive activities as a part of these programs.

**Project Success:** Hosts 5 programs that have facilitated services within these communities. The first being the Family Tree Adoption Connections Program which assisted a total of 15 families. The Family Tree Adoption Connections Program sponsored multiple events throughout the year including summer camp choices where families were able to decide which camps best met their child's needs. The second being the Family Centered Services Program that assisted multiple families of which 34 youth from Danville area were served this year. The third being the Teen REACH Program which assisted youth at the Danville YMCA and the Danville Housing Authority. The fourth program is the Communities for Youth Program which provided intensive case management for 15 youth who had been involved with the juvenile justice system as well as anger management programs with the District #118 Alternative School site at Laura Lee Fellowship House. The fifth program is the 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program based at Danville High School and South View Middle School. The South View site coordinator reported 420 youth participated in this after school program. The Danville High School site coordinator reported 268 students involved in their after school program. The Danville High School program offered credit recovery programming on Saturdays during the spring semester. The Danville High School site coordinator reported 268 students involved in their after school program. **Salvation Army:** In Danville 254 individuals were assisted with shelter, 2,225 nights, 1,678 with food, 68 with power & water, 608 with prescriptions, 390 with rent, 1,011 with Clothing & H. H., 91 with bus tokens & 253 referrals only. In Tilton 28 individuals were assisted with food, 2 with power & water, 5 with prescriptions and 4 with clothing & H.H.

**Vermilion County Rape Crisis Center:** Danville: 47 Clients received Counseling, Medical Advocacy, and Legal Advocacy services. A total of 341 hours of service were performed. 1022 participants received a total of 83 hours of Prevention Education.

**WorkSource Enterprises:** Provided services to 121 individuals with disabilities in Danville and 2 in Tilton. WorkSource provided vocational evaluations to sixty individuals in Vermilion County. Sixty-four consumers received pre-employment training resulting in thirty-six community placements and nineteen successful closures. Twenty-five consumers worked in-house in a program known as Regular Work or Extended Employment. WorkSource has been involved in transition planning activities for youth exiting high school since 1989.

Twenty-seven percent of the individuals served last fiscal year were between the ages of sixteen to twenty-four. Most recently WorkSource received a one- time ARRA grant that will expire in August 2011. At that time there will be eighteen consumers without continued funding.
